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POLICY PLAN - period 2020 to 2025

A FIVE YEAR PLAN FOR THE NORTH AND MID WALES ASSOCIATION OF LOCALCOUNCILS

1.	HISTORY
1.01	The Association has a history spanning over 30 years representing Town and Community Councils in North and Mid Wales.
1.02	The Association has taken the formal decision not to be part of One Voice Wales but to continue in its present form but to seek to work with One Voice Wales.
2.00	INTRODUCTION
2.01	The Association has in recent years taken a more active role in taking Forward common members concerns and has now achieved some links with the Welsh Government and Parliament direct.
2.02	The policy is to stand for a period of 5 years subject to annual review at the Annual General Meeting.
2.03	A review of actions taken during the last plan period is set out at appendix A.
3.00	MEETINGS
3.01	The Association shall hold at least 4 meetings per annum in accordance with the Standing Orders and Constitution of the Association.
3.02	The Annual General Meeting shall be held in July of each year.
3.03	The Chair, Vice Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Auditor and Treasurer a shall be elected annually at the annual meeting in accordance with the Standing Orders and Constitution of the Association.
3.04	The Association shall appoint and elect members to an Executive to conduct business between main meetings and to formulate with the Secretariat the main agenda for Quarterly Meetings



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4.00 MEMBERSHIP AND SCOPE OF AREA

4.01 The membership of the Association shall be open to any Town or Community Council whose geographical area lies within that from Aberystwyth and Newtown in the South, the Coast to the North and and the borders of Wales with England in the East in accordance with the Standing Orders and Constitution of the Association.

5.00 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- 5.01 The aims and objectives of the Association are as follows:
 - a) To give a forum for member councils to discuss common issues.
 - b) To respond to relevant consultations with regard to both Parliament and the Welsh Assembly.
 - c) To support and act upon subjects agreed by the members.
 - d) To represent and promote members views of the Members wherever they are needed.

6.00 POLICY

- 6.01 The subjects listed at **appendix B** are those which have been accepted as a priority by the majority of the membership. The Climate Change action plan is set out at **Appendix C**.
- 6.02 The list can be added to or subtracted from at each Annual Meeting.
- Subjects for actions shall be approved by the Executive and confirmed at the Quarterly Meetings. A current update of the subjects being taken forward with actions and updates are to be put on the web site and circulate with the agenda for each quarterly meeting.
- 5.04 The policies in this document supersede those contained in the previous plan.

7.00 CONSULTATIONS

- 7.01 The Association shall respond to consultations which are relevant to the members.
- 7.02 The Association shall offer to both Parliament and the Welsh Assembly the opportunity of members being represented on any committee.



8.00	PLAN OF ACTION
8.01	A plan of action shall be agreed at the time of being taken forward by the Executive and Quarterly Meeting.
8.02	A plan of action shall be agreed by the quarterly meeting on other topics to be added to the policy document. Such additions to be confirmed by the Annual General Meeting when the plan is reviewed.
9.00	LOBBYING
9.01	The Association shall use its resources to lobby the authorities relevant to each policy item.
9.02	To achieve this aim a monthly update shall be prepared which will be posted on the Association's web site.
9.03	Meetings with relevant authorities, MP's and AM's can be attended by Members or Officers or both. However, only the Association policies may be promoted at these meetings.
10.00	COMMUNICATIONS
10.01	The agenda and minutes of the meetings shall be posted on the web site within 7 days of the meeting.
10.02	The agenda for any meeting shall be posted on the web sites each at least 7 days before any meeting is due to take place.
10.03	
	The agenda and minutes of meetings shall be made available to MP's, AM's, County Councils and One Voice Wales as well as Members.
10.04	
10.04 11.00	AM's, County Councils and One Voice Wales as well as Members. A press release shall be issued to local press and local news web sites
	AM's, County Councils and One Voice Wales as well as Members. A press release shall be issued to local press and local news web sites following each meeting if the meeting so directs.

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11.03	The web site shall contain contact details and also details of local PM's and AM's.
11.04	The web site shall contain a documents section where members can view background papers for agenda items and also papers which form consultations completed by the Association.
11.05	The web site shall be published at its own domain at www.northwalesassociation.org .
12.00	MONITORING AND REVIEW
12.01	The Plan is to be the subject of a progress report at each Annual General Meeting and shall be presented in written form and shall be reviewed at that meeting.
12.02	Any member wishes to alter the general policy document must request such in writing to the Secretary at least 7 clear days before the AGM.
12.03	The Plan shall be reviewed in April 2025 in full.
13.00 13.01	GENERAL POLICIES The Association has adopted and the documents published on its web site polices as follows: Constitution Standing Orders Code of Conduct

14.00 TRAINING

14.01 The Association shall support training programmes and urge members to attend those run by recognised bodies and County Councils.
